**St. Nicholas Day is today:** The true story of Santa Claus begins with Nicholas, who was born during the third century. His wealthy parents, who raised him to be a devout Christian, died in an epidemic when Nicholas was young. Obeying Jesus' words to "sell what you own and give the money to the poor," Nicholas used his whole inheritance to assist the needy, the sick, and the suffering. He dedicated his life to serving God and was made Bishop of Myra while still a young man. Today known throughout the land for his generosity to those in need, his love for children, and his concern for sailors and ships. The Bishop would help those in dire need by tossing bags of gold, through an open window. These gifts were said to have landed in stockings or shoes left before the fire to dry. This led to the custom of children hanging stockings or putting out shoes,

eagerly awaiting gifts from Saint Nicholas the giver of gifts. To this day we celebrate his generosity and faith by mimicking the tradition.

**Parents taking students out of school during school time:** Please consider the consequences to your child before you make a decision to take your child out of school for a family trip that is not an emergency....understand that when you take your child out of academic instruction it causes stress to the student. They are often lost when they return, feel badly that they are behind, and often struggle to understand what is being taught when they return. We see the stress in the child and often they struggle initially coping with the insecurities and extended demands including the increased amount of homework that is required to bring them back to the level of learning
