As previously announced, Madam Sutter will be working next year as our full time 9-5 academic coach serving both title one students and those students who need individual and small group help. The position will be created with Debbie and the help per the needs of your students from all of you.

Ms. Tucker will move to middle school as our 6th grade homeroom and 6-7-8 ELA teacher and remain as our PT Vice Principal.

I have hired Michele Morales to be our 3rd grade teacher next year. Michele has been a 3rd grade teacher for 11 years at St. Cornelius school. She is very familiar with CCSS and SBG. Enroll for 2018-2019 school year: Everyone has to enroll with InfoSnap for the next school year! *You will receive an email from zguardado@csdo.org that provides current families a link and invitation to enroll for the 2018-19 school year.* If your information remains the same, the process should be no more than 10 min. At that time, you will need to pay a registration deposit of \$150.00 Although we encourage you to do so then, you can check the box marked "check" and pay in the office. Note that you will not be considered registered until your full registration is paid.

Last payment for the 2018-19 Registration/Enrollment fee due: Thank you to all who have paid or made a partial payment toward registration for next year. Of course we hope you are returning and we are encouraging you to pay registration because some of our classes are filling up. **We will be starting a waitlist for Kindergarten** after our next testing on April 20th. Additionally, if you signed up for our **ELP Summer Program**. **You must have paid Registration/Enrollment in full by May 1st.** Please note, if you are not returning to St. Paul School next year, your child may not attend our ELP Summer Program for insurance purposes.
